J-Block

Is there a sport you've been playing since you were five? For James Blake, it is tennis. In the fall of 1992 though, when James was thirteen, he probably moved very stiffly and had trouble playing. This is because James had back problems and had to wear a full-length back brace eighteen hours a day. Although he could take it off while he played tennis, James had to wear the brace for five years. This didn't stop him.

James quickly gained a reputation as a fierce competitor. He was very quick and hit the ball with a lot of power. Over time, he worked his way up the pro rankings. He became the third African American to play in the Davis Cup for the United States. The Davis Cup is a very important tennis tournament. Many people believed James was going to be one of the best American players ever!

As if James's back problem hadn't been enough of a challenge, he was in a terrible accident in 2004. He was in Rome, and he was practicing on a slippery clay court. James ran into the net post and, in a **fraction** of a second, broke his neck. Then a year later, James developed shingles, a disease that caused his vision to be blurry. How could he play tennis with bad eyesight? Many people thought James would never be able to play tennis again, but James would not allow his years of hard work to be wasted. He knew he still had a lot to **contribute** to the sport.

It was a long **process**, almost a year, for James to recover from his Rome injury. He wasn't sure if he could still **compete** against top players, but he wanted to badly. He needed to test himself against top pros, so he returned to the professional tennis circuit.

When James returned to pro tennis, he was ranked 210th in the world. James believed he could do better. He pushed himself and fought to **improve**. His neck and body became more **flexible**, and eventually, he achieved a ranking of 49th among tennis **athletes**. Later that year, he won the championship in a major tennis tournament. James was back!

James Blake retired from tennis in 2013. Prior to his retirement, he was one of the best players in the world. He has been an inspiration to people. At any of his matches, groups of people wore hats that said "J-Block." The J-Block was a group of fans that always appeared in the stands, rooting for Blake whenever he played.






